

Kickstarter Video 2019: Transcription *Length: 3:12*

Opens on close ups of several F(r)iction staffers (Anna, Kenneth, Mia, Helen, and Andrew), all speaking in quick succession.

Anna:	Remember a story that enchanted you?
Kenneth:	Inspired you?
Mia:	Changed the way you thought?
Helen:	The way you felt?
Andrew:	So do we.

Dani: This is F(r) iction. A collection of stories and art that brings that magic back. Four years ago, F(r) iction started as a passion project of a ragtag group of editors. Armed with dedication, stubbornness, and a good amount of duct tape...

Anna: ... Metaphorical duct tape...

Dani: I mean, and some literal. We've become one of the fastest growing literary journals in the world.

Kenneth: From Jeff Vandermeer to Lydia Davis, Kwame Dawes to Alasdair Gray, some of the biggest names in the literary industry have graced our pages.

Andrew: F(r) iction isn't just about celebrity talent. It's about creating a home for diverse and underserved voices. From stories and poems by veterans and women in Afghanistan, to the LGBTQ and incarcerated communities, F(r) iction champions unique voices from around the globe. Helen: Whether it's traditional literary fiction, or genre bending sci-fi, fantasy, and horror, we look for stories and poems that move us. That challenge our assumptions about the world.

Mia: And because nothing makes us happier, or prouder, than launching the careers of brand new voices, our dedicated team of more than thirty editors fight for the stories they believe in, working closely with authors to bring their work to life.

Kenneth: And the result? Over thirty percent of our published work comes from the slush pile.

Helen:	And it's not just the literature that sparkles.
Anna:	We commission original illustrations for every single piece we publish, making our pages as beautiful and vibrant as the stories within.
Dani:	We even publish an original comic in every single issue.

Helen:	Cannibalism.	
Anna:	Scandinavian folklore.	
Dani:	An island of dolls.	
Anna:	We've got it all!

And we've got a lot planned for the next year of F(r) iction, including features with Joyce Carol Oates, Lev Grossman, Nick Flynn, and so much more.

Dani: But we could not do this without you. As one by one, literary beacons are forced to close, this is a difficult time to champion great stories. But we refuse to give up and this Kickstarter is the first step towards continuing to publish this strange beast of a book. And with your help, we hope to do more than just merely survive.

Andrew: We want to expand F(r) iction online, with a swanky new website, increase our resources to help pay new and diverse writers, and make sure important new voices are being heard.

Kenneth: If we reach our goal, we can make sure the new vanguard is more diverse and exciting than ever.
